Goal of Course: After successful completion of the course, students will be able to create sampling schemes for surveys; analyze survey data using ratio and regression methods; understand strata and weighted samples; analyze cluster sample data and two-stage samples; analyze and estimate variability in complex surveys; apply categorical data analysis and regression to complex surveys.
