The Department of Statistics at the University of Georgia invites applications for two full-time Lecturer positions in Statistics, starting August 1, 2022. Applicants must have a Ph.D. degree in Statistics or a related discipline by the time of appointment. Credentials should reflect a strong commitment to teaching statistics and introductory data science courses, and show demonstrated potential in instruction. The person in this position is expected to teach a variety of courses, from introductory-level to upper-level undergraduate courses, some of which with an enrollment cap of no more than 19. The person hired is expected to be engaged in the activities of the department and to play a major role in building the University's teaching mission. We are also committed to building a diverse faculty. This is a non-tenure-track faculty rank with a career ladder.

Applications should include: 1) cover letter, 2) curriculum vitae, 3) a teaching statement that highlights experience and interest in teaching undergraduate statistics and/or data science courses, 4) a copy of the graduate school transcript, and 6) statement on commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion. Applicants should also provide names and contact information for at least 3 references using the online system.
