The Department of Statistics at the University of Georgia invites applications for a Lecturer position in Statistical Data Literacy and Intensive Writing, starting August 1, 2019. Applicants must have a Ph.D. degree in Statistics or a closely related discipline by August 1, 2019. The person in this position is expected to design and teach an introductory undergraduate course on statistical data literacy using R and is responsible for the writing-intensive portions of undergraduate capstone courses for Statistics and Data Science majors. There will be also opportunities to teach other undergraduate courses and/or applied graduate courses. Successful applicants are also expected to have excellent critical thinking and writing skills. Scholarly and teaching credentials must reflect a strong commitment to teaching. Like all faculty members, the person hired is expected to be engaged in the activities of the department. This is a non-tenure-track faculty rank with a career ladder.

At this site, candidates should also upload a cover letter, a curriculum vitae, a copy of the graduate school transcript, and a teaching statement that highlights experience and interest in teaching introductory undergraduate courses and applied graduate courses in statistics. Upon receipt of the application, the three references supplied by the applicant will be asked to submit letters of recommendation on the same website. Review of applications will begin on **January 15, 2019**, and continue until the position is filled.
