Recommended Course Materials: "The Practice of Statistics for Business and Economics" 4th edition, Moore, McCabe, Alwan, Craig.

Course Purpose:

The course covers statistical applications in business, involving graphical and numerical descriptions of data, data collection, correlation and simple linear regression, elementary probability, random variables, Binomial and Normal distributions, sampling distributions, and confidence intervals and hypothesis tests for a single sample.

The purpose of this course is to prepare students for further study and job preparation in the field of Business. It will emphasize understanding of data and interpretation of statistical analyses. It will require students to think of data, and report the results of their analyses, in context.

Course Objectives:

This course has been approved to meet FSU's Liberal Studies Quantitative and Logical Thinking requirements and is designed to help you become a critical analyst of quantitative and logical claims. In order to fulfill the State of Florida's College mathematics and computation requirement the student must earn a "C-" or better in the course.

By the end of the course, students will demonstrate the ability to:

1. Select and apply appropriate methods (i.e., mathematical, statistical, logical, and/or computational models or principles) to solve real-world problems.

2. Use a variety of forms to represent problems and their solutions. The above two competencies will be assessed in the Liberal Studies Quantitative Assessment for STA 2023, which includes a written summary of results.

3. Use descriptive statistics and graphical methods to summarize data accurately.

4. Use inferential statistics to make valid judgments based on the data available.

5. Describe the goals of various statistical methodologies conceptually.

6. Apply statistical techniques in the context of business processes, everyday life, and further studies in their discipline.

7. Develop a healthy skepticism toward statistical studies and their results based on a sensible consideration of the techniques employed.

Lectures:

With no on-campus class for this course, we cannot hold lectures in the traditional, inperson classroom setting. I will be recording my lectures and either uploading them directly to Canvas or uploading them to YouTube and posting links to Canvas.

For the lecture videos, I will be teaching through the notes for each module, explaining the statistical procedures as well as walking through the filled-in examples step-by-step. I recommend printing out the blank version of the notes to have on hand going into these lecture videos, as you guys can fill-in the answers to the selected examples as you follow along with me. You can expect between 2-3 hours of lecture videos every week.

Office Hours:

My office hours will be by-appointment only. They are available between 9 AM-5 PM Monday-Friday on a non-Quiz week, but limited to Monday-Thursday on weeks which have a Quiz which opens on Friday. If you'd like to meet me in office hours to discuss a past assessment or receive extra help understanding the class material, send me an email with times in the allotted window that works for you and we can schedule a meeting. These will be held over Zoom.

Online Assignments

These assignments will occur roughly every other week on Canvas. <u>Unlimited attempts, as well as collaboration with your classmates, will be allowed over a few days</u>. They will be open Thursday at 8 AM and due Sunday at 11:59 PM. There will be no make-ups or extensions.

Assessments: Online Quizzes & LSQA

There are 7 Quizzes in total (1 being the LSQA). Each will be posted to Canvas at 8:00 AM on the Friday of about every other week, and will be due at 11:59 PM on that Sunday. They will comprise of various multiple choice, short answer, matching, and free response questions. You will have 1 hour to complete each guiz attempt, including the LSQA. You will be also be allowed 2 attempts at each guiz. After completing a first attempt, you may review it to see which questions you answered correctly/incorrectly. However, you will not be able to see the correct answer itself. Solutions will not be posted even after the guiz window closes; however, you may discuss them with me in an office hour meeting. NO LATE SUBMISSIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT A PROPER DOCUMENTED EXCUSE ACCORDING TO THE UNIVERSITY **ATTENDANCE POLICY.** If you miss an assessment and need to send me documentation, please email me and we can arrange a make-up time given valid documentation. If you are aware that you will miss an assessment window ahead of time, please email me with documentation 24 hours before it opens and we can arrange a make-up time. Assessments that are not taken, and assignments that are not submitted, will receive a grade of zero. If a make-up is granted, the zero will be replaced with the earned grade.

- 1. There will be 6 online quizzes (NOT including the LSQA) which will cover the lecture material posted after each previous assessment. The lowest 1 of these 6 will be dropped and not count towards your final grade.
- 2. There will be 1 Liberal Studies Quantitative Assessment (LSQA), which will cover one topic. For study purposes, treat this as you would a quiz. This is mandatory and cannot be dropped as a lowest grade.
- 3. There will be no cumulative final exam.
- 4. All assessments will be open-note. You should prepare for them by having your TI-84 calculator (or emulator), scratch paper, a secure internet connection, and a writing utensil at hand. Collaboration with classmates is not allowed on quizzes and doing so will result in a violation of the Academic Honor Policy.

Preparation for online quizzes:

- I will post a Canvas announcement the week of every quiz listing the topics and class notes that each quiz will cover.
- Study the information and examples in the class notes that are specified in the announcements. Since the quizzes are open note, I recommend having the notes with filled-in examples on hand.
- Do all of the DIY exercises in the notes
- Do all of the extra exercises posted with the notes
- Be sure you know how to use your calculator appropriately for the various statistical methods
- Contact me for an office hours meeting for any extra help

Grades will not be curved, and there will be no opportunities for extra credit, makeups, or any other forms of grade improvement after the Last Day of Class. Therefore, you should do your best throughout the entire semester.

Missing grades:
